

**Argument Project Part 2: Propositional and Quantifier Formalization**  
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1. Empathy can be inhibited by bad first impressions, due to lack of trust and other factors. (premise)
2. Many autistic people empathize with, and even view themselves analogously as aliens. (premise)
3. Neurotypical children are unnerved by atypical forms of communication, leading to a bad first impression. (premise)
4. Atypical communication between autistic children is associated with a positive social response, preventing bad first impressions. (premise)
5. A group which empathizes more with its audience will be better at communicating with them than an unempathetic group would. (premise)
6. Aliens do not communicate the way typical humans do. (premise)
7. Autistic people would be more likely to have a good first impression with an alien than neurotypicals. (from 2, 3, 4, 6)
8. Autistic people would likely be more empathetic towards an alien than neurotypicals. (from 2, 3, 7)

## 5. Fallacious Arguments:

### For (Appeal to Irrelevant Authority):

- “The President of the American Nazi Party stated that Israel is evil because it is a Jewish state. The US contributes billions of dollars in military aid to Israel every year. Therefore, the US should withhold military aid from Israel.”
- This argument is clearly an appeal to irrelevant authority because it invokes a statement from a very biased individual who likely knows nothing of the matter and bases his statement on antisemitic tropes unrelated to the relevant moral quandary.

### For (Slippery Slope):

- “The US contributes billions of dollars in military aid to Israel every year. If we continue to send aid to Israel, then one day we will eventually have given all our money to Israel. To be a country with no money at all is surely bad. Therefore, the US should withhold military aid from Israel.”
- This argument presupposes a ridiculous conditional proposition. Just because the antecedent is true, it is almost entirely outside of the realm of possibility that the consequent will follow.

### Against (Appeal to the Bandwagon):

- “The US contributes billions of dollars in military aid to Israel every year. Most of the American Jewish community would like this trend to continue. Therefore, the US should continue to send military aid to Israel.”
- This argument relies on the affirmation of a majority opinion to support the conclusion. Widespread support, even unanimity, does not guarantee the truth of a claim, which has been shown many times throughout history.

### Against (Appeal to Hypocrisy):

- “The US contributes billions of dollars in military aid to Israel every year. Israel may be committing war crimes, but the US has also committed plenty of their own. Since they’re no better, it would be hypocritical for the US to stop sending military aid to Israel.”
- This argument attempts to invalidate a moral argument by supposing that hypocrisy is worse than further moral and political consequences. Whether or not the US is a hypocrite if they were to withhold aid from Israel, it does not change the value of the decision.
