Noteworthy adaptations in instructional strategies have been implemented to fortify the alignment between course instruction and program objectives, thereby enhancing the preparedness of students for prospective roles as middle grades educators. In order to enhance student comprehension and proficiency in executing the Teacher Work Sample (TWS), a strategic approach involving the provision of supplementary scaffolding has been implemented. This scaffolding methodology is designed to provide targeted guidance and support to students, aiding them in navigating the complexities of the TWS process effectively. By offering this additional scaffolding, students are empowered to grasp the intricacies of the TWS framework, ensuring a more comprehensive understanding and successful application of its principles in educational practice.

MGE Faculty members wish to reduce the number of times students are taking the Praxis. Embedding support mechanisms within courses will better support our students. MGE faculty have been more deliberate at talking about how best to prepare for these Praxis content area tests and explaining to the students the best semester to take the tests for a higher success rate.

Follow-Up (Provide your timeline for follow-up. If follow-up has occurred, describe how the actions above have resulted in program improvement.)

During the 2022-2023 academic year, the success rate for the ELA test was 80% and was 100% on the Social Studies exam. This year's data includes a passing rate of 65% on the ELA test and 89% on the Social Studies test. This data represents a 28% decrease in ELA and a 45% decrease in Social Studies.

MGE professors would like students to be more successful the first time they take the Praxis content tests. Therefore, professors will provide test practice on the content area tests so students are more aware of test content. In addition, Social Studies courses have been aligned to teaching standards this academic year.

Next Assessment Cycle Plan (Please describe your assessment plan timetable for this outcome)

This outcome will be assessed again in one year (August, 2023). Praxis data for our students will continue to be collected. Professors of the MGE 475 and MGE 481 courses will be responsible for helping to prepare students for the Praxis exams.
