Results: The Fall 2023 and Spring 2024 cohorts did not have 80% or greater that met the minimum recommended score of 850 in this area. The score in the Scope of								
Practice sub category was lower in Spring 2024 than in Fall 2023. Both semesters, the class percentage meeting the benchmark was near or above 60% which is one of								
our stronger sub categories on the Exit Exam as a whole.								
Conclusions: We did not meet the 80% goal for this category. There was improvement toward meeting the goal as noted above in the results section. We are continuing to utilize Elsevier/Evolve 360 Package products including Shadow Health, Specialty Exams in semesters 1-3, Case Studies and EAQ to prepare students for this exam and ultimately the								

NCLEX. There have also been changes to the NCLEX that have necessitated adding more content related to clinical judgment and utilization of knowledge from prior coursework in all courses across the curriculum. As students who have been exposed to the clinical judgment model across the curriculum move into 4th semester, we feel the scores on this exam may improved. The will be a new faculty member in both first and fourth semester courses in Fall 2024. These are locations in our curriculum where many issues related to Scope of Care are discussed. We will evaluate how the change in course faculty impact scores in this area.

In addition, faculty do not believe these subscores reflect the true ability of our students. Some students have reported rushing through the exam just to get it finished. The course points associated with this activity are a maximum of 10% of the total grade (this is the mamiximum level a standardized exam can be based on KBN guidelines), and many students are not concerned that a lower score on this activity will impact the overall course grade.
