Measurement Instrument 1	<p>The measurement instrument of this SLO includes the review of a Venue Analysis assignment in RSA 534 (Facility Management). This assessment consists of identifying a recreation or sport venue, research it, and report on various elements associated with the venue per course topical areas. The primary venue elements included in this assignment and in the evaluation include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introduction (name, location, type, description, ownership, and governance) • History (year established, purpose, financing) • Facility Management (mission, staffing, key stakeholders, computer-aided facility management software used) • Human Resources (employee classifications, contracted services, recruitment methods) • Future (leading-edge features, pandemic implications, etc.) 		
Criteria for Student Success	Upon completion of the assignment, students should score 80% or above based on the evaluation criteria provided. Student success on this activity is achieved by clearly addressing each element of the assignment. Elaborating on each element with information found during the research phase is imperative.

Results, Conclusion, and Plans for Next Assessment Cycle (Describe what worked, what didn't, and plan going forward)			
<p>Results: The results were vastly improved from the previous assessment cycle. Each element included in the Venue Analysis was covered in the course prior to the activity being assigned. Students demonstrated more success in transferring theoretical knowledge, obtained in the course, to the practical aspect of the analysis.</p> <p>Conclusions: A more proactive approach to this assignment was inferred from the instructor. This probably led to a higher success rate, as it's not an activity that can wait until the last minute to complete.</p> <p>Plans for Next Assessment Cycle: Program faculty will continue to evaluate the RSA 534 venue analysis assignment. A greater emphasis will be placed on introducing course topics and content prior to launching the assignment. Additionally, it will be stressed to students the importance of identifying a venue in which they can gather the appropriate information.</p>

Criteria for Student Success	Upon completion of this course activity, students score 80% or above based on the evaluation criteria provided. Student success relative to this activity is achieved by following the instructions and requirements associated with each element. This includes, but is not limited to, producing a report of the student’s meeting with the agency supervisor; submitting a personalized schedule; detailing a workplan with timeline; providing progress reports; and submitting a final report with all required documentations.

Results, Conclusion, and Plans for Next Assessment Cycle (Describe what worked, what didn’t, and plan going forward)				
Results: The results were expected and not surprising. Typically, when students take RSA 590, they are at the end of their program and are excited to apply what they have learned from previously completed courses in a practical setting. Program faculty expected student success with this SLO, and the results yielded no surprises.				
Conclusions: The course was modified during the previous assessment cycle and proved to help facilitate more intentionality from students regarding practicum proposal, plan, and timeline. Past Practicum courses consisted of many forms that didn’t allow for a strategic, intentional approach from the student as the new modification did. Effective communication between the student, site supervisor, and faculty supervisor will continue to be an essential component of the experience.				
Plans for Next Assessment Cycle: Program faculty will continue to evaluate RSA 590 and the elements included in this SLO. Currently, four elements of the activity are included in Measurement Instrument 1. Requiring students to obtain more clock hours during the Practicum is being considered.

The most common corrections relate to trying to accomplish more than is probably possible in the timeframe and not providing enough detail in the timeline. This is very helpful when we want to look at our student performance over time. To administer the survey, and to help protect the integrity of the data, the faculty member sends the link directly to the agency supervisor near the end of the course.</p>	<p>The student would not have access to the survey unless the supervisor were to send the link to the student. This is a critical piece in determining whether a student has demonstrated the ability to work successfully with the agency.</p>
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
