Additionally, they are to provide an executive summary that details the following: a) detailed description of the grant, b) deadline to apply, c) funding source, d) size of grant, e) application instructions, and f) personal reflection as to why the student feels the funding opportunity is worthwhile to pursue. Finally, students are to locate the official application and submit with their executive summary.
