IA students tend to be high-achieving and to do well academically, and the 18-19 review of this work supports this. There is an opportunity to sharpen their analytical skills, and we recently added research methods as an elective to the major. We are also in the process of additional curricular reform, with particular focus on ensuring graduates are prepared for graduate study.

Although comments here and about each outcome indicate satisfaction with student performance, in reviewing the entire process, we identified the existing student learning outcomes as too complex and difficult to measure effectively. We have therefore simplified them and will use the following for the next review cycle:

**Student Learning Outcome 1:** Students will identify dynamics of the international political and economic system.

**Student Learning Outcome 2:** Students will illustrate the complex relationship between domestic and international issues.

**Student Learning Outcome 3:** Students will be able to contrast characteristics of diverse regions, cultures and countries.

We will also provide rubrics for subsequent review cycles.

One change that had been made previously was to add a research methods course as an elective to the major. Students who have completed that course seem to do a better job with the critical assessment. Our advisors are going to encourage students to take the course to sharp their ability to critical analyze international issues. An effort will also be made to incorporate additional assignments in courses that require analytical reasoning.
