
Career coaches are available to discuss post-graduation plans, and help assist students in creating a personal brand that will assist them in their internship or job searches.







Overall through our co-curricular tracking in Suitable, we engaged 16.8% of WKU's 4,800 first-gen students, with 1,177 Suitable activity completions 307 of which were in the Career and Professional Development competency, representing more than 26% of all tracked engagement. 





Career Launch

Emphasizes the importance of networking and relationship-building in today's competitive job landscape. Through hands-on exercises and connection to the WKU Alumni Association's Career Consultants program, students gained the confidence and skills necessary to navigate professional interactions successfully and develop relationships with professionals they previously were not connected with.

ISEC

Promotes a culturally inclusive campus environment, cultural awareness and competence, inter-group dialogue, engagement and intercultural interaction, and supports lifelong learning about self and others. A hands-on recruitment and retention resource for the many cultural, religious/spiritual, and identity groups reflected within the WKU community. The center provides student support services to foster academic success and sponsors culturally based celebratory events.





First Gen Advocate Mentoring

Designed to support first-generation college students through structured mentorship, goal setting, and reflective journaling. The program included a mentor match event, five structured mentor meetings, and guided reflections submitted via Blackboard. Our goals were to build connections between students and WKU faculty/staff, enhance self-advocacy, and improve retention through relational and academic support.

TRIO-SSS

Group of federally funded college opportunity programs that motivate and support students from disadvantaged backgrounds in their pursuit of a college degree. TRIO programs provide academic tutoring and advising, counseling, mentoring, financial guidance, and other assistance necessary for educational access and success.

First Destination Survey


Western Kentucky University administers the First Destination Survey to recent graduates including both undergraduate and graduate students to gain insight into their career outcomes and future plans. The data collected plays a key role in measuring the effectiveness of a WKU education and allows for comparison with national benchmarks. This survey follows the standards set by the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) and the MBA Career Services & Employer Alliance (MBACSEA), ensuring our methodology remains consistent and nationally recognized.

We also know that some students may complete the survey prior to graduation, and may subsequently find a job, gain admittance to graduate school, or otherwise finalize their post-college plans without updating their survey response. We know that employment numbers continue to rise in the months following graduation. Due to these limitations, this data does not reflect a complete picture of all outcomes for 2023 - 2024 WKU Graduates.


By consistently tracking and analyzing this data, WKU is committed to supporting student success beyond graduation and strengthening our career development resources year after year.


