
### Q25 - Have you sought employment since graduating? (APR B.5.)








### Q28 - If you gained employment in your respective field, how long after you graduated

### Q29 - If you gained employment, where did you secure employment? (APR B.5)




Q30 - After graduation, did you/do you plan to seek graduate/professional school admission (i.e., doctoral degree program)? (APR B.5)








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

The live synchronous zoom classes were just as effective as in person class and were much more convenient for someone also working full-time.

I also really liked that I could be in the comfort of my own home to go to class. I can take care of my own needs (like grabbing a small snack and not being loud) then vs having to leave the lecture room and missing out on content.
