Please check with a WKU Owensboro advisor to determine your best, most efficient path to becoming General Education Certified. This can mean an AA/AS from KCTCS or completing WKU General Education. Each student's situation is different, therefore it is important to consult a WKU academic advisor as soon as possible.

Students who transfer to WKU with an applied associate degree (e.g., Associate of Applied Science) from a health-related program receive a 12-hour waiver from the overall upper-level course requirement for the health science major. Students who transfer to WKU with an applied associate degree from a health-related program will need to meet 23 hours in the major upper-division hour requirement and 30 hours overall upper-division requirement.

Students must have an area of concentration. Available areas are: Preparatory Health Sciences, Health and Social Welfare, or an Associate's Degree in a health field. Ask an advisor about classes fit into the concentration.

** If students choose to take a lower-division statistics course, they will need to take an additional upper-division course to meet the upper-division requirements.
