Procedures for full Professorship recommendation

b. Promotion to Professor/Pedagogical Professor

If there are candidates for promotion to the rank of Professor/Pedagogical Professor, the department or school establishes a Promotion Committee composed only of tenured Professors/Pedagogical Professors, excluding those ineligible to serve (see Section III.E.2.c below).

All promotion committees considering applications for the rank of Professor/Pedagogical Professor must have at least five (5) members. For departments/schools with fewer than five tenured Professors/Pedagogical Professors, the dean will add tenured Professors/Pedagogical Professors from other departments/schools to bring the membership to five. These additional members need not be the same for each candidate for promotion.

b. Promotion to Professor/Pedagogical Professor (paragraph 2)

If there are candidates for promotion to the rank of Professor/Pedagogical Professor, the department or school establishes a Promotion Committee composed only of tenured Professors/Pedagogical Professors, excluding those ineligible to serve (see Section III.E.2.c below).

All promotion committees considering applications for the rank of Professor/Pedagogical Professor must have at least five (5) voting members. For departments/schools with fewer than five tenured Professors/Pedagogical Professors, the dean will add tenured Professors/Pedagogical Professors from other departments/schools to bring the membership to five. These additional members need not be the same for each candidate for promotion. The department chair/school director serves as an additional ex-officio, nonvoting member of each committee.

3. Rationale for revision:

The revisions make it clear that the committee established requires five (5) tenured faculty voting members and that the unit administrator is a non-voting ex-officio member of the committee.
