Students who transfer in an AAS degree will receive a 12-hour upper-level requirement waiver

Prior to enrolling in SPM core courses, students must complete 5 prerequisite courses with a grade of "C" or better (Comm 145, ECON 202, MGT 210, MKT 220, & SPM 200). Upon completion of these requirements, students can enroll in SPM core courses. The remaining hours required to meet the university's requirement of 120 hours should be used to either: 1) take other electives of interest to the student or 2) select a minor or certificate that best prepares them for entry-level positions related to their interest within the sport industry. Complementary minors include, but are not

limited to athletic coaching, broadcasting, business administration, economics, marketing, finance, nonprofit administration, and facility and event management.
